Italian invasion of Greece October 28th, 1940 - Italian first wave plans and units - Greek first-line units and their dispositions

The Italian first wave attacking columns (task forces), their directions of attack and objectives and the Greek covering forces they would first meet as well as the first defensive line. Greek forces have been placed under the corresponding direction of attack - in order to have an idea of the exact composition of the opposing forces - but there is some overlapping on the Greek Sectors. Finally the XXVI Italian Army Corps did not take part in the October 28th invasion but it is mentioned for the sake of completeness of the front: from the sea opposite Corfu to Lake Prespa on the Greek-Albanian-Yugoslavian border.

DIRECTION OF ATTACK: KALPAKI

Italian forces

From the Vojussa - Dhrinos Sector in Albania the 'Ferrara' and 'Centauro' Divisions' forces concentrated in attacking like a fan on the main traffic center of Kalpaki (Kalibaki in the Italian documents and maps) in four columns; Kalpaki was their intermediate objective. Forces available would then move to the direction Ioannina - Arta.

a) Solinas Column (of the 'Centauro 'Division)

Then (from Konitsa in he north moving south) the following sectors were the first line of defence :

Reserves: I/15 Battalion, one field artillery squadron - battalion - (two batteries), one 105mm Skoda horse-drawn artillery battery, two 75mm Skoda artillery batteries, one 105/19 artilery battery, one 65mm infantry gun troop.

Kalamas & Negrades Sectors anti-tank artillery: two field artillery batteries, one Skoda artillery battery, one 37mm anti-tank gun, two infantry gun troops, four 13.2mm heavy machine-guns, two mountain artillery batteries, one 65mm artillery troop.

Direction of attack: Katsika - Filiates - Vrysela.

DIRECTION OF ATTACK: METSOVO

Italian forces

Two attacking groups of the 'Julia 'Alpini Division.

a) 80 Alpini (8th Alpini Regiment) in three attacking columns:

Btg. Tolmezzo (Tolmezzo Battalion)

Btg. Gemona (Gemona Battalion) and Gr. Conegliano (Conegliano Artillery Group - minus one battery -)

Btg Cividale (Cividale Battalion) and one Battery / Conegliano Artillery Group Artilley total : three batteries

Direction of attack: Stavros - Fourka - Samarina - Vovousa - Metsovon. Final objective: Zygos Pass (1620m, today called Katara) on the way to Thessaly from Metsovon; to occupy a defensive position to the east of it. Intermediate objective: Fourka and Vovousa.

^{&#}x27;Siena 'Divisional Command is mentioned as having eight 20mm guns, too, by some sources.

b) 90 Alpini (9th Alpini Regiment) in two attacking columns:

Btg. L' Aquila (L'Aquilla Battalion) with one Battery / Udine Artillery Group Btg. Vicenza (Vicenza Battalion) with one Battery

The order for 'Julia' Division was: "To attack from the area of Erseka-Leskoviki and capture the Metsovo and Driskos Passes, to prevent the enemy forces in Epirus to withdraw and to obstruct probable enemy reinforcements to Epirus from the areas of Macedonia and Thessaly".

Direction of attack : Golio, Western Smolikas - Distraton. Final objectives : Plaka (1593m) and Peristeri/Lakmos (2294m); to occupy a defensive position to the west. Intermediate objective : east of Elatochori. It had to move towards Metsovo, passing by Smolikas mountain.

Greek forces

The Pindus Detachment as covering forces: 51st Infantry Regiment, 1st Border Covering (Screening) Company Vourbiani / Konitsa Border Covering (Screening) Battalion with one machine-gun platoon, one 75mm mountain artillery battery / 1st Mountain Artillery Regiment, one cavalry troop / I Reconnaissance Group, one 65mm artillery troop, two mortars, signals platoon and B' Muleteers Company.

The area around 'Julia's 'attack before October 28th had two battalions of the 51st Infantry Regiment, one Border Covering (Screening) Company and a Cavalry Troop. Forces on October 28th were placed as follows: the 6th Company (reinforced) / 51st Infantry Regiment to the north, the II / 51st Infantry Regiment (Reinforced) without its 6th Company to the centre, the I / 51st Infantry Regiment (Reinforced) without its 2nd Company to the south and the III / 51st InfantryRegiment as reserves in the Eptahorion area - these were the covering forces -. Because of the Greek mobilization, however, there were also Vth Brigade units in the area (I & II / 2nd Infantry Regiment, I & II / 52nd Infantry Regiment) as well as 1st Division units (I / 4th Infantry Regiment, II / 5th Infantry Regiment and 57th Infantry Regiment's elements), which constituted the first line of defence.

ATTACKS ALONG THE COAST

a) Andreini Column : 30 Granatieri (3rd Grenadier Regiment) One Albanian Volunteer Battalion One 65mm battery One battery / 29th Artillery Regiment of the ' Parma ' Division

b) Moritzi Column : 70 Lancieri ' Milano ' (7th ' Milano ' Lancer Regiment) One 65/17 battery

Direction of attack: Igoumenitsa - Parga - Louros

Direction of attack: Mazarakia, Margariti, Arta

c) Imperiali Column : 60 Lancieri ' Aosta ' (6th ' Aosta ' Lancer Regiment) One 65/17 battery

Direction of attack: Along the coast to Preveza.

Another Albanian Volunteer Battalion is mentioned in the forces attacking along the coast, but not specified in which column it was placed.

Greek forces

Neohorion and Parapotamos Sub-sectors are also detailed above in the Italian middle and low Kalamas direction of attack as covering forces.

Thesprotia Sector, from the Ionian Sea to Mesovouni Heights and Raveni village: Parapotamos Sub-sector (Filiates Covering Battalion - minus one company -, 5th & 11th Companies / 24th Infantry Regiment with two machine-gun platoons and one 75mm mountain artillery battery).

Neohorion Sub-sector (II/24 Battalion, one mortar company of the 24th Infantry Regiment and one 75mm mountain artillery battery).

Artillery: 21st Mountain Artillery Regiment (75mm): one battery to each of the two sub-sectors.

Reserves: Headquarters III/24 Battalion with its 10th Company, two machine-gun platoons, VIII Sappers Company and the VIIIb Mountain Operating Theatre.

Further south there was the Preveza-Philippiada Sector, from Preveza to Kastrosykia: I/24 Battalion (minus one company), 24th & 39th Infanrty Gun Companies (65mm), one field artillery battery and one machine-gun company / 2nd Mobile Machine-gun Battalion. These forces were sent to the Thesprotia sectors when the Italian attack commenced.

Objectives: '...to guarantee the safety of the left flank of the attack on Epirus and the area of Korce in Albania'.

3rd & 4th Infantry Regiments, one Albanian Battalion, 24th Artillery Regiment (minus one battery), four 47mm guns, two 65/17 batteries, one mortar battalion and six 20mm guns.

Greek forces

From north to south.

a) IVth Infantry Brigade (IX Frontier Sector), from Laimos Prespon to Mali Madi : Prespes Sub-sector : II / 16th Infantry Regiment (-) & II / 65th Infantry Regiment (-), one infantry company and one machine-gun company / IX Frontier Sector, 33rd Infantry Gun Troop, one 75mm mountain artillery troop, one field artillery troop and machine-guns.

Varbos (Central) Sub-sector: 33rd Infantry Regiment (minus III Battalion), II / 30th Infantry Regiment and two 75mm mountain artillery batteries.

Vatohorio- Mali Madi Sub-sector : 28th Infantry Regiment, one IX Frontier Sector company, two 75mm mountain artillery troops, one field artillery battery and machine-guns.

IVth Infantry Brigade Artillery: two 85mm heavy artillery batteries & one 155mm heavy artillery batteries / S1 Heavy Artillery Regiment.

Reserves : III / 33rd Infantry Regiment (with eight anti-tank rifles), II / 50th Infantry Regiment & I / 66th Infantry Regiment.

There also was a reinforced Covering Battalion and six batteries available in the area.

- b) IXa Frontier Sector, from Fragovista Neck to Agios Zaharias as covering forces: 1st, 2nd & 3rd Companies.
- c) IXth Infantry Division, from Kostonetsi & Kriopigi to Agios Zaharias : Northern Sub-sector : 32nd Infantry Regiment (minus I/32 Battalion) and one battery / IXb Mountain Artillery Squadron Battalion -.

Central Sub-sector : 53rd Infantry Regiment (minus III Battalion) and one battery / IXb Mountain Artillery Squadron - Battalion -.

Southern Sub-sector: 27th Infantry Regiment.

IXth Infantry Division Artillery: IXc Mountain Artillery Squadron - Battalion -, B1 Heavy Artillery Regiment (two 85mm batteries), B2 Heavy Artillery Regiment and B1 Field Artillery Squadron - Battalion -.

Reserves : I / 32nd Infantry Regiment, III / 53rd Infantry Regiment and the IX Reconnaissance Group - minus one troop - .

Three dots (...) denote part of the text has not been translated.

- II. Forces actually in Albania
- a) Higher formations: 2 armies, 7 corps, 26 divisions (21 infantry, 4 Alpini and 1 armoured)

Non divisional troops: 3 Bersaglieri regiments; 3 cavalry regiments; Alpini battalions 'Valle', 'Susa' and 'Intra'; some blackshirts battalions, various other elements.

- b) Distribution of the above forces:
- 9th Army : 2 corps, 8 divisions (6 infantry, 1 Alpini), 1 Bersaglieri regiment, 2 Alpini battalions
 - 11th Army: all the rest in 4 corps.
 - At the disposition of the Higher Command : XIV Corps.
- III. Distribution of the forces (in directions of movement)

...

Western direction (Ionian): Epirus and Akarnania (one corps of 3 divisions), Corfu (one division), other islands (one division). Total: 1 corps, 5 divisions.

Eastern direction (Aegean): Western Macedonia (one corps of 3 divisions), Thessaly (one corps of 3 divisions), Attica and the island of Euvoia (one corps of 3 divisions). Total: 3 corps, 9 divisions.

The Peloponnese: 1 corps of 3 divisions.

Grand Total: 1 army, 5 corps, 17 divisions.

The number of higher formations may seem excessive, but in the beginning we have to strongly ensure security in Greece; later, according to the political and military situation (of that time), there can be a reduction of forces. There are 9 divisions left in Albania and some non divisional troops. Of these divisions:

- 4, with a corps command, for the security of Albania;
- 5, with a corps command, are available for other uses (in the Motherland or elsewhere).
- IV. Organisation of the Occupying Forces.

- a) It is evident from the positions of the two armies that:
- 11th Army will occupy Epirus, Akarnania and the Ionian Islands (Ionian direction);
- 9th Army reinforced, will occupy the other three regions: Eastern Macedonia (typographical error?, the document means Western), Thessaly, Attica, Euvoia and, probably, the Peloponnese.

So:

- the 9th Army has to use all its higher formations (2 corps, 8 divisions) and receive reinforcements of 1 corps and 4 divisions from the 11th Army and one corps from the Higher Command.
- the 11th Army has to use one corps of 5 divisions, give one corps of 4 divisions to 9th Army, provide security for Albania with 1 corps of 4 divisions, relinquish command of its other 5 divisions with a corps command to the Higher Command.

...

- b) An essential characteristic of the occupation of the Greek territory has to be speed. So all motorised and mechanised (fast /celeri) troops available will be used:
- In the 9th Army : one Bersaglieri regiment (4th), one cavalry regiment (formed by squadrons given by the 11th Army), the Forestry Militia Self-transported Group (raggrupamento autoportato milizia forestale), 2 self-transported battalions/squadrons.
- In the 11th Army : 'Centauro 'Armoured Division, Bersaglieri regiments, cavalry regiments.

In addition, it is necessary for each army to form a manoeuvre group equipped with vehicles (*autoraggruppamento di manovra*) to 'accelerate ' to its maximum the columns advance.

Higher Command can follow the itineray: Korca - Florina - Kozani - Larissa - Athens (with succesive Headquarters at Florina - Larissa - Athens).

- V. Succesive stages of the occupation.
- a) Ionian direction:
- 1. Occupation of Epirus with fast (*celeri*) units from Philippias Arta and Preveza. Operation supplied from a well-placed base in the old borders (with Albania) or in Argyrokastro (in Albania).
 - 2. Organising a supply base in Epirus.
 - 3. Occupation of Akarnania.
- 4. Occupation of Corfu, at the same time or after the above (with the Royal Italian Navy).

Estimated time: 15 days.

b) Aegean direction:

- 1. Occupation of Western Macedonia with fast (*celeri*) units to Elassona Deskati Grevena. Operation supplied from a well-placed base in the Korca area.
 - 2. Organising a supply base in Kozani.
 - 3. Occupation of Thessaly, with fast (celeri) units in Lamia and Volos.
 - 4. Organising a supply base in Larissa.
 - 5. Occupation of Attica and Euvoia (also using the railway line Larissa Athens).

Estimated time: 1 month.

- VIII Army Corps (Rome Army Corps), in the direction of Ioannina (Metsovo), will go to the area of Athens Euvoia Lamia;
- Corpo Armata Speciale, in columns behind VIII on the direction Ioannina Metsovo, will be in Thessaly;
 - XXVI Army Corps, in the area of Grammos Mountain, will be in Macedonia;
- III Army Corps, closer to the railway line Florina Athens Korinthos, will move by train to the Peloponnese.

D. Succesive stages and routes of advance.

In accordance, also, with the evacuation of Greek territories by the Germans.

I Part : occupation of Epirus by the XXV Army Corps; itinerary : Ioannina - Arta - Messolongi.

II Part : occupation of the area of Athens - Euvoia - Lamia, Thessaly, Macedonia (with the priority shown before , in parralel with the evacuation of the regions mentioned by the Germans); itinerary : Bliishti - Florina (for Macedonia), Ioannina - Metsovo - Kalambaka - Trikala - Larissa - Lamia - Thiva (for the area of Athens - Euvoia - Lamia and Thessaly)

III Part : occupation of the Peloponnese ; itinerary : Bilishti - Florina and thence by train (Athens - Korinthos).
